

Hagerty 100[®] All Metal Polish Tips and Precautions

- 1. Surface should be dry and free of loose dirt before polishing. Apply a small amount of Hagerty 100® to a soft cloth. Rub vigorously in a circular motion. Buff with a clean, dry cloth. Do not allow Hagerty 100® to dry. If dried polish remains in crevices, remove by applying rubbing alcohol with a Hagerty horsehair brush or soft toothbrush then buff again with a clean dry cloth.
- 2. To remove rust and heavy corrosion, apply with #0000 steel wool and buff with a clean, dry cloth. For marine corrosion use #0000 bronze wool. If the item to be polished has a rough finish, (such as cast iron or aluminum) apply with a wire brush to remove heavy rust, scale, and lime deposits, etc. If item has a highly polished or painted finish, follow directions in item #1 above. Additional applications may be required.
- 3. Hagerty 100® is safe to use on properly primed and painted metal surfaces, and on polyurethane, acrylic, or epoxy coated surfaces. Polish according to directions in item #1 above. Never use steel wool or brushes on painted surfaces. Do not use on latex paints, varnish, lacquer, or shellac.
- 4. For plastic surfaces, apply a small amount of Hagerty 100® to a damp cloth and rub lightly. Buff with a clean dry cloth.
- 5. Not recommended for use on gold or silver electroplated surfaces or jewelry. Electroplating is frequently very, very thin. Polishing with anything other than the gentlest polishes can remove the plating and expose the base metal. For gold and silver electroplate we recommend the use of Hagerty Silversmiths'® Polish, Hagerty Silversmiths'® Wash, Hagerty Silver Foam, a Hagerty Silver Duster. For jewelry, use Hagerty Jewel Clean, Hagerty Pearl Clean, or Hagerty Silver Clean.
- 6. Safe for use on most instruments. For brass, use as directed in item #1.
- 7. Not for use on wood, leather, or other absorbent materials, or on non-stick coatings such as Teflon™.
